The pair have never looked back; in two years, A suit That Iris has gone from one tiny office in the City to a nationwide network with a catwalk show under its belt. The company has hundreds of fabrics and linings to choose from on its website and personalised details can include everything from colour-detailed stitching to hand-sewn lapels. Suits take around six weeks to complete, alterations can be done in Britain and cheaper options are available if you self-measure according to their on-site instructions.
